



#### THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

A period of silence is kept.

*Presider* Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

People Therefore let us keep the feast.

All baptized persons are invited to receive Communion. Our custom is to receive the bread on extended hands and to help guide the chalice to the mouth by touching its base.

Intinction-dipping the wafer in the wine-is not practiced.

To receive a blessing instead of the sacrament, cross your arms over your chest. If you need to have Communion brought to you at your seat, please inform an usher. Gluten-free bread is available upon request.
