allowing reflection on The Passion*

## THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

*Leader* In this holy season of Lent, let us offer prayers to God who leads us through the wilderness saying, Lord, in your mercy, Hear our prayer.

*The Leader offers intercessions on behalf of the congregation; during the silences the people may add their own petitions, silently or aloud.*

*Each petition concludes* Lord, in your mercy.

*People respond* **Hear our prayer.**

*Leader* ... and glorify you, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

*Our custom is to receive the bread on extended hands and to drink from the cup. Intinction is not permitted at this time. To receive a blessing instead of the sacrament, cross your arms over your chest.*
