Dear People of Grace,

Consider this a preview of coming attractions. Very soon you will start hearing a lot about stewardship here at Grace. Please resist the urge to change the channel as many of us are tempted to do when PBS offers a tote bag or NPR promises a mug. Here's the thing: stewardship is not about keeping the lights on (although without it, we can't keep the lights on) nor is about becoming a better person. It's about what mysterious, wondrous miracle is growing right in front of us. Are we brave enough to harvest and share what has grown around us?

The person who taught me the most about stewardship is Charles LaFond, priest and writer. He often tells this story:

I remember a summer's day in which I was taking a friend on a tour of my farm. She oed and ahhed over a summer squash (which was fabulous!) and though my impulse was to reach down and pick it for her to take home, something inside me sputtered, crackled, chilled, hisssssed and withdrew. "I had had a poor crop" a voice in my head said. That squash was the

only one I could see. So I smiled, rather too sweetly, and we moved on. She would not get my last squash. It was mine..myyyyy  
....prrecciousssss.... (My inner Smeagol was taking over my gentler Gollum.) The next day, I was playing with my dog Kai and his ball went into the garden. In searching for it among the squash plants, I lifted leaves and found six huge squash. More than I could possibly eat. I had never grown squash so I had no idea they might be UNDER the low canopy of leaves.

Fr. LaFond's theory about us humans is that we are not greedy people. We are scared people. Too scared to stoop to look closer. We are people who won't pick what we think might be our last squash. Only to find when we look underneath the leaves, that we have more than we could ever use on our own.

In the month of October, we can be brave together. We can look underneath what is growing at our feet, paying careful attention, because there is more there than we usually notice. This month, we will learn together that giving is grace. And we are the people of Grace. And it's a great time to give at Grace!

## Clergy Forums

Over the next program year Mother Susan and Father Asa will be leading Sunday *Clergy Forums* following the 10:00 am Mass. Mother Susan will be teaching once a month about our liturgical life together; introducing fresh ways of thinking about our current corporate worship expressions. Father Asa will lead a monthly discussion on some of the ancient spiritual practices that can help shape our modern lives. He will cover topics such as Sabbath, Fasting, Prayer, and Pilgrimage.

In response to his observation that book sales on eastern religions were skyrocketing, and second only to books on how to 'get rich quick' and/or 'succeed in business', Dr Peter Senge (an MIT educated scientist and author) was asked why he thought there was such a surge of interest in the ancient eastern religions. Dr Senge replied that most of those traditions, like Buddhism for example, present as a way of life or an experience whereas western traditions, particularly Christianity, have focused more on doctrine and assent. Dr Senge closed his response by saying Christians would be well served to "rediscover their own faith as a way of life, because that's what people are searching for today. That's what they need most."

Over this academic year I am excited to facilitate a journey for our confirmands in an exploration of a way of life that helps them to live into the faith that they received at their baptism. During the academic year we will focus on a myriad of spiritual practices that help us move our beliefs into a way of life, rather than an enshrined and exacting system of doctrine and ritual. It is my hope that when the academic year is over these confirmands will not only be able to confirm their faith as found in the Nicene Creed and the rest of


our Book of Common Prayer, but also live more fully into that faith as disciples of Jesus Christ, by living in their community in a manner that proclaims the Good News that the Kingdom of God has come near.

During this same time period I will also be offering a formation series focused on these Christian spiritual practices in my monthly Clergy Forum. This series is designed to allow our community to look more deeply into the practices the church has participated in for more than two centuries, and relate them to our common life in this parish. We will explore the beauty and richness in the mystical and spiritual foundations of our Anglican tradition, hopefully finding ways we can incorporate these ancient practices into a modern way of life that enriches our community with renewed life.

Over a period of weeks in October, you will see work being done around the interior perimeter of the structure, new piping laid to expedite drainage, gray stones replacing the red stones now in use, and the walkway bluestone replaced in areas and leveled. 



## Financial Update

*This report covers from January 1, 2019 through August 31, 2019.*

**Total Income:**

Budgeted Amount: \$ 507,953  
 Actual Amount: \$ 441,283  
*Actual Amount is Under Budget: (\$ 66,670)*

Pledges continue around 81% of the budgeted amount, and Plate is hovering below 66%. A shortfall of the Pledge income shortfall represents almost all (63,182 or 99%) of the underrun. Plate Offerings are also below the budgeted amount by \$2,719.

**Summary:** We are currently running a deficit, which continues to grow. **Without an increase in pledge income we will not be able to continue to offer and support the various ministries of Grace Church at their current level.** Starting the 4th quarter, we are waiting on the receipt of a number of pledges which have traditionally been received sometime in the first quarter. The Vestry is monitoring both income and expenses, and, is considering adjusting the budget.
